President-elect Mario Cesar Martins de Camargo joined Rotary in 1980 at the age of 23. A past director and trustee, he will be the fourth Brazilian to serve as president of RI. De Camargo says Rotary's global reach never ceases to impress him. "With Service Above Self, Rotary has created a unique global identity that is unlike any other I know. I think we all need to remember that we belong to an organization that opens up the world to us."

RI Director-elect Brian Hall will serve in the 2025-2027 Rotary years from Zones 30 and 31. Brian is a member of the Rotary Club of Covington, LA. He served as District 6840 Governor in the 2014-2015 Rotary year. Brian was active with the Host Organizing Committee of the 2011 Rotary International Convention, where he served as the chair of the Technology Committee, and as a member of the RI Promotions Committee for the 2019 Honolulu convention.





Ms. Lisa Williams, a Polio survivor, was the co-founder and president of 3D Research Corporation in Huntsville, Alabama. She was born in Saigon, Vietnam on the 4th of July. She came to the United States at the age of six. Ms. Williams was awarded the Small Business Person of the Year for the State of Alabama by the Small Business Administration, and was also awarded Top 10 Women Entrepreneurs of America.



Here's what you need to know about our venue, Chattanooga Marriott Downtown and the adjoining Chattanooga Convention Center.

- Valet parking is available. Or you can self park. From the parking garage, go to the ground level, turn right out of the elevator, and follow the signs to the lobby.
- The restaurant, some of the meeting areas and the House of Friendship are on the second floor of the Marriott.
- The Convention Center meeting areas are on the ground level.
 You can use the escalator at the far end of the 2nd floor meeting area to move between the two groups of meeting rooms.
